Introduction

The document forms part of the February 2022 EPI report, 'COVID-19 and Disadvantage Gaps in England 2020', which examines 'disadvantage gap' in education – the gap in grades between disadvantaged students and their peers. The report considers how the disrupted awarding processes in 2020 impacted upon the grades of students from different backgrounds

This document contains all geographical data breakdowns from the EPI Disadvantage Gaps report, including across local authorities, parliamentary constituencies, and city regions in England. It includes data on the gap at two levels of education (key stage four and five), different levels of disadvantage (students who are class as 'disadvantaged' and students who are classed 'persistently disadvantaged' – those in long-term poverty).















